TAC –Youth Leadership Programs





Golfview Manor Civic Association Teen Action Council (TAC) is a student leadership program designed to offer youth, ages 12 yrs. To 18 yrs. Of age opportunities through service to build leadership skills, team building, problem solving and planning projects which benefit our community. The Youth Leadership Programs offer monthly community service hours for area students.

We are a 501c3 organization and following is a list of some of the projects our group is involved in.

Food Pantry—Community Service Distribution

- ◆ Youth work together to help coordinate and distribute food items to those who need a helping hand.

Spring & Fall Clean-ups for the Elderly and Disabled Residents and Veterans

- ◆ Students work together to rake, bag and clean-up yards throughout Dearborn Heights.

The Brown Bag Project

- ◆ Includes assembling sandwiches, chips, fruit or granola bars and bottled water.
- ◆ Bags are assembled the first Saturday of each month, January through May.
- ◆ Bags are distributed in partnership with Project Dignity Outreach

Back Packs for Education Project

- ◆ Distribute back packs to children using donations to the project to make sure no child is without at the beginning of the school year.

Dictionary Project

- ◆ Provide dictionaries to 3rd graders attending Dearborn Heights public schools.
- ◆ In 2018, over 600 dictionaries were provided.

The Blessing Bags Project

- ◆ Bags are handed out to underprivileged people in Dearborn Heights, as well as other surrounding communities.
- ◆ Bags contain small toiletries, such as shampoo, conditioner, soap, toothbrush, toothpaste and razors.
- ◆ Bags also contain tuna, ramen noodles, bottled water, granola bars, winter hats, gloves hand warmers and socks.
